Notes: Specific user scenarios were tested to ensure critical user paths were included for the doc's platform in the VPAT. All application content was not tested, but rather a crucial sampling of content was used for test cases.

Evaluation Methods Used:

A combination of automated and manual testing techniques was employed for the accessibility assessment.

- Manual assessment was performed using Chrome/NVDA on Windows 10 and extensive use of the keyboard.
- Automated tools used included axe Auditor and the axe DevTools browser extension. Assistive technologies employed included NVDA v.2024.1 Testing was performed by Deque.
